**Re:** **Administrative Report for the Week Ending April 5, 2019**

### ADMINISTRATION

1. Staff has filled the positions for the summer Pool Management positions and Front Box. Staff is still looking for additional lifeguards.
2. VM and AVM attended the North Shore Manager's meeting in Brown Deer.
3. Staff continues to work on the new website platform.
4. Building Board met on Friday, April 5, 2019.
5. 2019 Pool Bulletin was completed and sent to the printer this week. Residents should receive it in the mail early next week.
6. VM met with MMSD re: Indian Creek and other drainage issues.
7. VM and AVM met with Baird regarding 2019 capital financing structure.

### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

1. Yard waste spring cleaning continues.
2. Cleaning up rear yard from the materials from all of the water leaks this winter.
3. Tennis nets are all set on the tennis courts.
4. Staff is working on cleaning up all of the rain gardens and spring cleaning around Village Hall and the Police Department
5. Pothole patching continues throughout the Village.

### POLICE DEPARTMENT

1. Staff began background investigations on police officer candidates.
2. Officers responded to provide assistance to the Bayside Police Department during a three alarm fire at White Oaks Apartments. Officers provided traffic control and assistance on-scene.
3. Officers conducted a traffic stop for a speeding violation which resulted in the arrest of the driver for an outstanding warrant and the possession of marijuana. The citations will be heard in the municipal court.
4. Officers conducted a traffic stop for a registration violation which resulted in the arrest of the driver for operating with a revoked license. The driver was released after processing and will appear in circuit court.

5. Officers responded to a report of theft from the vehicle in Doctor's Park. The resident reported that their wallet was taken from an unlocked car by an unknown person. The officer assisted the resident with identity theft information to prevent fraudulent charges after verifying that the credit cards had not been used.
6. Officers responded to check the welfare of an individual and provide assistance. The resident advised they were an alcoholic and had consumed a quart of Gin. Officers provided assistance to the resident and made arrangements to seek treatment for the ongoing alcohol issues.

Speaking of prevention, did you know that most flu is preventable?

Diagnosed cases of influenza have dramatically increased over the last month in our region. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services believes that flu activity has not yet peaked in Wisconsin and that high influenza activity will continue well into April. The North Shore averaged one flu-associated hospitalization case each day last week (394 state wide) including patients of all age groups. Additionally, an area long term care facility had a small outbreak which was kept in check by mass vaccination in the Fall, early diagnosis, prophylactic treatment of the exposed with TamiFlu and quick isolation of the ill. The best way to prevent flu is to get the vaccination in the fall. However, it is not too late to receive the flu vaccine. It is still recommended if you are medically able. Even if you have been vaccinated, if you suspect you have the flu (sudden onset of fever, chills and cold-like symptoms accompanied by muscle aches), early diagnosis by a medical professional is essential as treatment to lessen symptoms is only provided within the first 48 hours.
