Re: **Administrative Report for the Week Ending November 5, 2021**

ADMINISTRATION

1. Staff met with Bassett Mechanical about Village Hall HVAC system.
2. Village Board meeting agenda and packet for Tuesday, November 9, 2021 were generated, posted, printed and delivered by staff.
3. Staff worked with SEWRPC to finalize redistricting prior to 2022 elections and submit to Village Board for adoption.
4. 2022 Budget Summary and Public Hearing Notice was posted by staff this week to be heard on Monday, November 22, 2021 at 7:00 p.m., via Zoom or in-person.
5. Public Hearing Notice for redistricting was posted at the Village Hall and the Village website on Tuesday, November 2, 2021 by staff.
6. Plan Commission meeting was held and attended by staff on Monday, November 1, 2021.
7. All Village Hall and Police Department staff have implemented Multifactor Authentication.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

1. Staff completed normal garbage, recycling, and yard waste collections.
2. Leaf collection crews will begin working 10-hour days Monday through Thursday.
3. The wind screens on the tennis courts were all taken down.
4. Continued work on developing future forestry plans.
5. Mechanics began preparing snow removal equipment in advance of the winter season.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

1. Officers responded to a report of a theft after a resident reported that a firearm was missing from their home. The resident advised the officer that the firearm was last seen a week ago and is unsure as to when it was taken. The firearm will be entered into the national stolen property database. The investigation remains open.
2. Officers assisted a subject who came to the station to report that they had been defrauded of \$1600.00 through an email scam. The subject received an email "from their boss" advising them to buy gift cards on their behalf and provide the card numbers. This is an ongoing

national scam and the Department regularly reminds people that gift cards are for gifts and not a form of payment.

3. Officers assisted a resident who wanted to report a theft and possible assault that occurred the prior day at an event in Milwaukee. The officer provided assistance to the resident but does not have jurisdiction over the incident due to the location of the offense.
4. Officers responded to a report of a burglary after several subjects entered a home with the intent to steal property. The offenders gained access by posing as a utility worker and one person distracting the homeowner while others entered the home. The investigation remains open as the officer works with other agencies to identify possible suspects.
5. Officers responded to a report of a disabled vehicle after a passerby reported that a van had left the roadway and was stuck in the ditch. The officers interviewed the driver and determined that they were operating under the influence of alcohol and prescription medications. The driver was arrested for the offense and will appear in municipal court.
6. Officers provided assistance to Whitefish Bay police with a prolonged vehicle pursuit. Fox Point officers were able to deploy tire deflation devices (stop-sticks) to aid in ending the pursuit. The driver was arrested after a foot pursuit from the car. The incident will be handled by Whitefish Bay.
7. Officers responded to a report of disorderly conduct related to a verbal dispute. Officers were able to identify the subjects involved and resolve the matter. No criminal charges will be filed related to the matter.
8. Officers distributed candy during the Halloween trick-or-treat period and attended the community bonfire the prior evening.

NSHD Healthy Highlight 11/2/21: American Diabetes Month

This year's focus for American Diabetes Month is prediabetes and how to prevent diabetes. Prediabetes develops when blood sugar levels are high but not high enough to be considered type 2. Prediabetes can lead to the development of type 2 diabetes. About one-third of adults have prediabetes, but most don't know it. You can have it for years without symptoms, so it often goes undetected until it progresses to type 2 diabetes. Signs and symptoms that suggest prediabetes has become type 2 diabetes include, but are not limited to: increased thirst, frequent urination, excess hunger, fatigue, and blurred vision.

If you discover that you do have prediabetes, it does not mean you will develop type 2 diabetes. You can prevent the progression to type 2 diabetes with a [treatment plan and lifestyle changes](#), like making healthy food choices and participating in physical activity. Even small changes can have a huge impact on delaying or preventing diabetes all together.
