**Re:** **Administrative Report for the Week Ending September 9, 2022**

### ADMINISTRATION

1. Treasurer and Accounting Financial Manager finalizing notifications of bank account change to close out WSB account and switch to Associated Bank account.
2. Deputy Clerk Treasurer Nathan Schafer has been working on completing all election training, as required.
3. Staff attended the Plan Commission meeting on Tuesday, September 6, 2022.
4. Clerks' office is working to prepare to send out absentee ballots on the date of September 22, 2022.
5. Board of Appeals notices were posted and mailed out to those within 500 feet for Cases 2022-09, 2022-10, and 2022-11; Board of Appeals meeting will be held on September 28, 2022.
6. Staff prepared, mailed and posted the Village Board meeting agenda and packet for the date of September 13, 2022.

### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

1. Staff met with the road and utility contractor and the subcontractors to discuss landscape restoration and ditching along Wye Lane. Staff is working with them to resolve some issues along the street.
2. The contractor sent a tentative schedule for finishing the water main work on Port Washington Road and, based on the schedule, it appears they will finish the work next week. Afterwards, they will have restoration activities remaining.
3. Staff has been assisting Waste Management with recycling collections this week (again) and staff is communicating with management at WM regarding their performance.
4. Staff continued to receive comments related to the Beach Drive coastal resiliency project and forwarded all comments to our consultant.
5. Staff worked on the proposed 2023 budget.
6. DPW staff responded to some downed limbs this week, performed regularly weekly activities and began crack routing in advance of performing crack filling this month.
7. Water utility staff flushed the new main on Port Washington because the contractor has not put it in service yet, performed regular water main maintenance (valve turning and

flushing hydrants), performed utility locates, and responded to high bill complaints and requests from residents related to their meters. Staff also put seals on the PRVs per a DNR inspection comment.

### POLICE DEPARTMENT

1. Officers responded to a report of suspicious activity after four subjects were observed pulling on car door handles. Due to the location of the incident, Glendale, Fox Point, and River Hills officers checked the area and three subjects were taken into custody. Fox Point residents reported entries to unlocked autos and the officers are attempting to link the suspects to the entries.
2. Officers completed training on building entry, searching and team movement. This training was in conjunction with our recent active shooter training. All training was completed at a facility that is scheduled to be razed and provided challenging scenarios for the officers to address.
3. Officers located a possible disabled vehicle on the side of the road with the driver sleeping in the car. The officer field investigation showed the driver had a revoked license and valid arrest warrants from the Milwaukee Sheriff. The driver was arrested for the warrants and issued citations for possession of drug paraphernalia.
4. Officers responded to a report of a theft of catalytic converter from a vehicle that was parked in a parking lot. The investigation remains open as surveillance video is reviewed.
5. Officers responded to assist River Hills police with a high-risk traffic stop that resulted in a pursuit. Fox Point officers deployed Stop-Sticks in an attempt to end the pursuit. The vehicle continued to flee with deflated tires and the matter was handled by River Hills.
6. Officers responded to a report of erratic driving after a vehicle was observed swerving on the roadway. The officers located the vehicle and a field investigation revealed signs of impairment. The driver was arrested for Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated – first offense. The case will be heard in municipal court.
7. Officers responded to a hit & run after a vehicle left the roadway and struck a utility pole and traffic signal before leaving the scene on foot. The officer located the driver and issued citations for the hit & run violation.
8. Sergeant Arendt provided assistance to River Hills police who request a Drug Recognition Expert evaluation on an impaired subject.
9. Officers assisted a resident who was reporting a vehicle that sits parked with the headlights shining into their residence. The officer provided assistance to the resident to resolve the matter.

### NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

#### **NSHD Healthy Highlight 9/7/22: Monkeypox 101**

Monkeypox is a disease caused by the monkeypox virus, which is in the same family of viruses as the smallpox virus. It is less transmissible and less severe than smallpox but can cause potentially serious disease in some people.

### How does it spread?

Monkeypox does not spread easily from person to person. People must have close, sustained contact with an infected person to get the virus. People usually become infected with monkeypox:

- By having direct contact with the skin lesions or body fluids of an infected person,
- Through sharing items, such as bedding or clothing of an infected person, or
- Through prolonged exposure to an infected person's respiratory secretions.

### What are the signs & symptoms?

- New, unexplained rash that develops into hard, round, fluid, or pus-filled skin lesions.
- Fever
- Swollen lymph nodes
- Muscle aches
- Chills

### What should I do if I have symptoms?

- Notify a doctor if you are experiencing a new, unexplained rash. If possible, call ahead before going to a health care facility and notify them that you are concerned about monkeypox.
- If you have symptoms, talk with a healthcare provider, ask about getting tested, isolate at home, and avoid close physical contact until a health care provider can examine you.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services recently expanded the [Monkeypox vaccine eligibility criteria](#), allowing for additional people to be eligible for vaccination.

“Expanding who is eligible to get vaccinated against monkeypox is a critical step in preventing further spread of disease,” said DHS Secretary-designee Karen Timberlake. “It is encouraging to see that the rate of new monkeypox infections is slowing, and this decision allows for even more Wisconsinites to protect themselves against monkeypox. DHS strongly encourages anyone who is eligible to get vaccinated to do so.”
