ADMINISTRATION

1. Staff met with Baird to discuss financing for Lake Michigan Revetment Project.
2. Village manager completed required annual MSRB/EMMA database filing.
3. Tax collection started in earnest. Drop box is available for usage during off hours.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

1. DPW staff have been busy with the following:
 - a. Regular rubbish and yard waste collections
 - b. Forestry requests for removals and pruning
 - c. Pot hole patching on Village streets
 - d. Sanitary sewer cleaning and annual maintenance program
2. Water utility staff:
 - a. Finishing up utility portion of the PSC report.
 - b. Started testing water meters that were removed this year. Work should be done in a week
 - c. Washed and prepared the utility truck for use
 - d. Suburb stop adjustment on Port Washington Road was completed on December 20
 - e. The utility assisted UPI on Port Washington Rd with removing a manhole lid on the 16" valve to check depth for their connection with Glendale's new water main
3. In the shop:
 - a. Mechanics worked on ensuring all snow equipment is ready for the upcoming storm
 - b. Performing routine maintenance on the rubbish scooters

POLICE DEPARTMENT

1. Officers conducted a traffic stop for a speed violation that resulted in the arrest of the driver. The driver falsely identified themselves and when the identity was verified, the driver was arrested for an outstanding warrant and obstructing an officer.

2. Officers responded to a criminal damage to property after an unknown person broke the front passenger window of a vehicle parked at a business. The owner of the vehicle reported that no theft had occurred.
3. Officers responded to assist the fire department with a death investigation. The officers investigated the death in conjunction with the medical examiner, and determined that no criminal acts had occurred. The officers assisted the family with notifications and arrangements.
4. Officers assisted a resident who has the victim of identity theft after they determined their credit card had been used without permission. The merchandise is scheduled to be delivered to area hotels. The investigation is ongoing.
5. Officers conducted a traffic investigation after locating a vehicle stopped in traffic that appeared to have been involved in a crash recently. The officer's investigation resulted in the arrest of the driver for operating while impaired and possession of marijuana.
6. Officers conducted a traffic stop for an equipment violation that resulted in the arrest of the driver for outstanding warrants.
7. Officers responded to a report of disorderly conduct between a postal worker and building manager. The officers worked with the involved parties and postal supervisor to resolve the issue.
8. Officer Wiesmueller responded to an officer involved critical incident in the city of Milwaukee as a member of the Milwaukee Area Investigative Team. The MAIT team investigates all officer involved shootings and critical incidents.
